Term 3

I Will Dwell In Your Midst - Zechariah (July 26 - Sept 27)

Zechariah is one of the longest and more significant of the 'Minor Prophets' (the twelve prophetic books that conclude the Old Testament.) He ministered to the returned exiles as they rebuilt the Temple, and gave them great reason to hope in the promises of the coming Messiah. Zechariah is quoted or alluded to at least 71 times in the New Testament, making it an important book for understanding the connections between the Old and the New.

Serving the Living and True God - 1 Thessalonians (November 15 - December 13)

Thought to be the earliest of Paul's letters, written to a young church made up of fairly new believers. It is a letter that addresses very practical questions about how the hope we have in Jesus shapes the way we live now, as we wait and long for his return.
